

- think of how they can be two-dimensional, create experiences that are both printed and environmental





EXHIBITION OVERVIEW

Myths and Legends gathers historical and contemporary works from the SCAD Museum of Art permanent collection whose compelling stories, characters, and morals have captivated audiences across time and space. These paintings, prints, and photographs illustrate artists' ability to convey the ineffable, layered qualities of legends and lore, despite their intergenerational and intercultural alterations. While reflecting individual narratives and often toeing the line of reality and fantasy, the works altogether reflect storytelling's transgressive history and impact on society today, from our spiritual belief systems, perceptions of gender and culture, to power dynamics.

The exhibition demonstrates myths and legends' ability to validate, challenge, and reframe certain ideologies, revealing their frequent use to influence public opinion and behaviors. Artists like Cindy Sherman and Andy Warhol reimagine icons from the collective imagination, such as Uncle Sam and the biblical figure Madonna, who personify societal values of faith, womanhood, and patriotism. Other artists like Claes Oldenburg and Marisol reframe understandings of historical myths or mythologized people, like Hercules and Pocahontas, while Jaune Quick-to-See Smith and Chloe West reclaim their positions as storytellers to recontextualize mythsregarding indigeneity and femininity.
